Identification of Tree(s) and Description of Works
Please identify the tree(s) and provide a full and clear specification of the works you want to carry out
The Magnolia Grandiflora is located in the back garden of number 42 Downshire Hill, on the eastern boundary of the garden adjoining number
41. This tree is about 4-5m high with a similar spread. Our client Mrs Hagen at number 42, who has recently bought the house, told us the tree
was flagged during her house survey as having caused previous subsidence issues to her property, in particular to her conservatory. The neighbour at number 41 is also concerned about the rapidly growing tree, which is quite unsuitable for the site, having a maximum height and
spread of 12m+ and 8m+. Both parties (at numbers 42 and 41) wish for the tree to be removed, and potentially replaced with a more
appropriate small tree for the location and surroundings. The neighbours at number 43 have also expressed their support in the removal of this tree.

We would like to remove the Magnolia Grandiflora altogether and replace with a smaller tree which better fits the conservation area, provides no future worries for building damage or subsidence, and causes less shade to number 41.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.

 - o marking all trees on the plan, but only numbering those to which you want to carry out work
 - o showing the approximate distance between the application tree(s) and buildings
 - o adding other relevant features on the site (e.g. greenhouse, paths)
