Noise levels Issues: outside the hotel and surrounding area this would increase daily and nightly not just by the members of the public at the dock stations but also by the operating staff that use vehicles to move and collect bikes, to and from the docking stations. This would affect directly the hotel and surrounding hotels, in what is a very residential area. The number of complaints from hotel guests would increase, and therefore, have a negative and direct direct financial impact on the business and other local hotels.</li><li>. Safety Hazards Issues: Very noticeable in local areas is the fact that a large majority of bike users that use the scheme simply dump the bikes, including on the floor, and this would cause a Safety Hazard issue for local residents, hotel guests and other members of the public that use Argyle Street daily for commuting and social reasons.</li><li>. Traffic Flow issues: the relocation of the dock stations would cause potential serious accidents, including pedestrians being hit by bike users and bike users being hit by cars due to the suggested traffic flow.</li></ul> <p>The Alhambra Hotel recommends that such proposed installation should take place further away from its intended location and recommends it to happen at the far end of Argyle Street, close to Gray's Inn Road or any other suitable location, in order to minimise the above issues.</p>
