The Council has considered your application and decided to grant consent subject to the following condition(s):

Conditions and Reasons:

1 No advertisement is to be displayed without the permission of the owner of the site or any other person with an interest in the site entitled to grant permission.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

2 No advertisement shall be sited or displayed so as to
(a) endanger persons using any highway, railway, waterway, dock, harbour or aerodrome (civil or military);

- (b) obscure, or hinder the ready interpretation of any traffic sign, railway signal or aid to navigation by water or air; or
- (c) hinder the operation of any device used for the purpose of security or surveillance or for measuring the speed of any vehicle

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

3 Any advertisement displayed and any site used for the display of advertisements, shall be maintained in a condition that does not impair the visual amenity of the site.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

4 Where an advertisement is required under these Regulations to be removed, the site shall be left in a condition that does not endanger the public or impair visual amenity.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

Informative(s):

1 Reason for granting permission:

The application relates to the display of 2 x externally illuminated projecting signs to the front and side elevation of the host building.

The level and method of illumination is considered appropriate and the signs do not obscure any architectural features of the building and are considered acceptable in terms of proportions and design.

It is not considered that the signs would be unduly obtrusive in the street scene. The proposals would preserve and enhance the conservation area.

The location of the signage is not considered harmful to either pedestrian or vehicle traffic. The proposal therefore raises no public safety concerns.

Special attention has been paid to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the South Hampstead Conservation Area, under s.72 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 as amended by the Enterprise and Regulatory Reform Act [ERR] 2013.

As such, the proposal is in general accordance with policies A1, D1, D2 and D4 of the Camden Local Plan 2017, the London Plan 2021 and the National Planning Policy Framework 2021.

2 Please note that this consent relates to the advertisements only and does not grant permission for any use that may require planning permission.

The display of illuminated advertisements internally (behind the glazing) as shown on the submitted drawings is considered to benefit from deemed advertisement consent, as defined by Schedule 3, Part 1, Class 12 of the Town and Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) Regulations 2007, and therefore, does not require formal determination by the Council in the form of an advertisement consent application.
