Rear Garden:

T1: Mature Plane: Approximately 21.00m: Reduce back to previous and most recent reduction points (approximately 2.50m all round). Remove dead wood. Thin inner crown by 15%. General maintenance/control encroachment.

T2: Mature Oak: Approximately 21.00m: Remove major dead wood throughout crown. Thin crown evenly throughout by approximately 20%. Reduce lateral and sub lateral branches growing to the South over the White House preserving suitable growth points. General maintenance. Reduce potential hazards. Increase light levels.

Left hand planting beds:

T3: Robinia: Approximately 9.00m: Remove major dead wood throughout crown. Reduce extraneous overlong branches back into main crown structure approximately up to 1.25m. General maintenance.

G2: Group of mature bays: Approximately 8.00m: (entrance to the orchard): Reduce back to previous and most recent reduction points (approximately 1.50m). Thin crown density of the group by approximately 30%. General maintenance.

T4: Holly: Approximately 9.00m: Reduce extraneous overlong branches back by up to 1.50m. General maintenance.

T5: Liquid Amber: Approximately 15.00m: Remove dead wood and broken branches. Thin crown density by approximately 20%. Reduce any overlong extraneous branches back into main crown structure, not more than approximately 1.50m-2.00m.

T6: Leaning Gleditsia: Approximately 9.00m: Reduce lateral and sub lateral branch structure overhanging the lawn by approximately 1.80m. To help balance and control encroachment.

T7: Yew: Approximately 8.00m: Reduce crown by approximately 1.30m. Reduce section of the crown overhanging the orchard by 2.00m. Thin crown density by approximately 25%. General maintenance.

T8: Leaning Cherry: Approximately 9.00m: Fell to ground level and grind stump to approximately 3.00m below current ground level. Canter on the main stem. Poorly formed crown structure, has a pronounced lean.

T9: Sorbus: Approximately 7.00m: Thin crown density by 20%-25%. General maintenance.

T10: Hornbeam: Approximately 21.00m: Remove dead wood only. General maintenance.

Trees to the rear of the Tennis Court:

T11: Norway Maple: Approximately 7.00m: Reduce crown by approximately 1.50m all round. Thin crown density by 20%. General maintenance.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.
