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# Identification of Tree(s) and Description of Works

Please identify the tree(s) and provide a full and clear specification of the works you want to carry out

T1 - Common Horse chestnut - Mature, previously reduced tree on the boundary of No.54 & 56.

- This tree has large damaged branches throughout the crown supporting a lot of weight.
- Reduce all aspects of the tree by approx. 3 metres.
- Remove 1 x low limb which overhangs the driveway to No.56 and appears to be mostly dead at the branch union.
- Remove 1 x large limb overhanging the driveway to No.54 which has a large cavity at the branch union.

- Remove all deadwood.

T3 - Sycamore (right hand side of rear garden) - This tree has previously lost a large limb over the garden and now has a cavity at approx. 5.5 metres above ground level.

- Reduce the crown of this tree by approx. 3 metres.

- Remove all deadwood.

T4 - London plane (right hand side of rear garden) - Remove 2 x large dead limbs overhanging the neighbouring playground.

T5 - Sycamore (far right hand corner of rear garden) - Remove large sections of deadwood overhanging neighbouring playground and garden to the rear.

T6 - London Plane (rear boundary) - This tree has some large dead branches with a diameter of more than 100mm throughout the crown. Some as large as 170mm in diameter. There is a large cavity on the main stem at ground level which shows a large amount of rot.

- Reduce the crown by approx. 6 - 6.5 metres.

- Remove all deadwood.

The idea here is to retain the tree but at a much smaller and safer size considering the dieback and cavities throughout. Access to the two council owned properties to the rear is required for the work to both T6 + T7. We will need to contact the council to see if we can extract the timber from these trees via the empty plot to the rear.

T7 - Holm Oak - Reduce height by approx. 2 metres and trim the sides to create a tight and tidy shape.

T8 - Lime - Reduce the branches that overhang the lawn by approx. 1.5 metres.

T9 - Holm Oak - Reduce the branches that overhang the lawn by approx. 1.5 metres.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.
