- (b) obscure, or hinder the ready interpretation of any traffic sign, railway signal or aid to navigation by water or air; or
- (c) hinder the operation of any device used for the purpose of security or surveillance or for measuring the speed of any vehicle

## Informative(s):

1 Reasons for granting permission/consent-

The proposal is for the display of 1x non-illuminated projecting sign. The design of the projecting sign accords with the design and placement of existing advertisements for the commercial units at the host property. The proposed signage is considered to be acceptable given the size, design, materials and location. The signs would therefore preserve the street scene and wider character of the commercial area and are acceptable.

The signs would not be harmful to either pedestrians or vehicular safety in accordance with guidance.

The site's planning and appeals history has been taken into account when coming to this decision. No objections have been received.

As such, the proposal is in general accordance with policies D1 and D4 of the Camden Local Plan 2017, the London Plan 2021 and the National Planning Policy Framework 2021.

The display of non-illuminated signs inside the building as shown on the submitted drawings is considered to benefit from deemed advertisement consent, as defined by Schedule 3, Part 1, Class 12 of the Town and Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) Regulations 2007, and therefore, does not require formal determination by the Council in the form of an advertisement consent application.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraph 38 of the National Planning Policy Framework 2021.
