Bartlett's Tree Experts did a survey of Ash trees in the West Cemetery in 2019, and identified areas where Ash die back was prevalent. Sector 13 as identified on the attached map was identified as an hot spot for Ash die back and it was recommended to fell approx 35 ash trees in the area that they recommend to fell. Planning permission was approved, but the work was not completed before the permission timed out, hence I resubmit this planning request, so that work can resume on removing potentially hazardous Ash die back trees.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.
