**Reasons for tree work (amended 17/02)**

**T1 Lime (Removal)** – Causing damage/collapse of 3<sup>rd</sup> party wall. Needs to be removed to facilitate rebuild and removal of roots. Images have been added to the portal

**T2 Lime (Removal)**- Causing damage/collapse of 3<sup>rd</sup> party wall. Needs to be removed to facilitate rebuild and removal of roots. Images have been added to the portal

**T3 Lime (Removal)** – This tree has a significant decay column at the base and needs to be removed due to damage to 3<sup>rd</sup> party wall. Needs to be removed to facilitate rebuild and removal of roots.

**T4 Lime (Removal)** – Causing damage to 3<sup>rd</sup> party wall. Needs to be removed to facilitate rebuild and removal of roots.

**T5 Lime** – Good tree management

**T6 London Plane (Removal)** – Asymmetrical crown with a large section of the crown over a third-party garden. Very large decay column. Approx 60% of trunk hollow. Probed to a depth of at least 1 meter below ground level. Decay extends approx. 7 meters up the stem which can be partially seen on the below images. A heavy reduction was considered, but then discarded due to the very poor access to the tree. As the tree worsens over time, there is no MEWP or crane access to facilitate the cyclical works required to re-pollard, or for its removal once it is at a point where it is no longer safe to climb. At present, we are just about happy to climb with minimal rigging. In the event of the tree failing, the potential damage to third party property and life is extreme.
